

new Knights of Columbus Council 909 building, located at 1620 E Ave NE. The building is pictured below. Kick off Father's Day weekend with a dance!




What Lowers Abortion Numbers Most?

In no particular order, the things that make a huge difference in abortion rates/numbers include:

- Peaceful Presence
- Pregnancy Resources
- Access to Ultrasounds
- No Abortion Providers
- No Planned Parenthood
- Abstinence Education

Peaceful Presence: Having a peaceful, prayerful presence outside of Planned Parenthood (PP) or abortion providers can give women the sign they seek to turn away from abortion. It also allows us a chance to point people to resources where they can get any help they seek. This is one reason we focus so much on this type of activity—it's so effective.

Pregnancy Resources: It's important to have supportive family and friends. But Pregnancy Resource Centers like Bridgehaven and Birthright help support anyone who is vulnerable to abortion. By offering help, they make it easier to raise children, regardless of the circumstances. We are blessed to have such great resources in the area.



Access to Ultrasounds:

Building off the pregnancy resources, the most powerful is the ultrasound. When women see an ultrasound of their child, they choose life the vast majority of the time. If the father of the child sees the ultrasound, the effect is even greater. Affordable ultrasounds make a huge difference, which is why organizations like Bridgehaven offer them for free.

No Abortion Providers: When access to abortion decreases, the number of abortions decrease as well. Abortion supporters often frame access in terms of having a provider in every county, but that's a bad measure. Iowa City provides more abortions per capita than anywhere else in the nation. Many people drive 30 minutes to Iowa City to get abortions in a different county. Distance matters most.

No Planned Parenthood:

Some PP facilities offer abortions, which fits in that last category. But as other issues of this newsletter point out, PP does things that correlate with higher abortion rates. When PP closed facilities in Texas, abortion numbers dropped significantly.

Abstinence Education: The affectivity of abstinence education programs has greatly improved beyond the "just say NO" mantra as such programs say yes to benefits of remaining pure. Yet, this goes largely unnoticed. Statistics regarding STDs, cancer and psychological concerns have greatly enhanced teens' acceptance of education programs promoting their own dignity.

Together: These things in combination bring abortion rates down. The Cedar Rapids area benefits mostly from the first three. We've seen some advancement when a local abortion facility closed in 2008. Sex Ed varies, especially when federal funds for abstinence education were cut in recent years.

Energy from Aborted Babies (Disturbing)

Perhaps one of the most disturbing news items of the year comes from power companies that incinerate the remains of children who were aborted so they can generate power. It disrespects the deceased.

When people treat others as medical waste, rather than people, it leads to this kind of thing. Medical waste, especially infectious waste frequently gets incinerated to minimize the chance of others contracting the disease.

But when healthy babies are aborted, they deserve the dignity we all share as human beings. To treat them as waste leaves some in sewers, others get incinerated; the forms of disrespect go on.

Most states dictate a variety of methods for disposing of medical waste, most of which include incineration. Incineration took on something more when power companies started using incineration as a method of generating power. When combined,

there is now a disposal method for abortion providers, and other companies now profit from the killing. lead to a similar result. Since women are told to flush the "product of conception" down the toilet, our sewers will fill



It's beginning to look like the medical and disposal communities need rules to respect children.

Incineration can make sense for most medical waste, but children are not waste.

When Kermit Gosnell was caught killing children as part of his abortion practice, we learned that his facility, like many other abortion facilities used the sewer as part of their solution for disposal. Similarly, webcam abortions in Iowa

with dead babies. With the way sewer systems work, many of these children may remain under a house for a long time, rather than flowing to the sewage treatment plant.


We need to respect life at all stages. We should not allow businesses to profit from the death of children, nor the destruction of their bodies as some means of disposal.
