

We have seen some very misleading things being said by abortion advocates. One involves the death of a woman in Georgia in 2022, shortly after the Dobbs ruling. People blame pro-life laws for the death of the woman, but they leave out a great deal.

The claim is that Amber Thurman showed up to a hospital with signs of sepsis, and wasn't treated for 20 hours, because D&C abortions were illegal. So, what was left out?

First off, she went to North Carolina and took an abortion pill, and took the other at home. About 20% of pill-based abortions lead to complications requiring medical follow-up. The so-called "safe" abortions that have been widely deregulated are NOT safe. Amazingly, abortion advocates twist this unsafe abortion to attack pro-life laws that save lives.

Yes, she had sepsis. Yes, doctors didn't treat it for 20 hours. The hospital lacked clear direction on how to handle such cases, even before the abortion law took effect. There were no signs that the delay was a result of the abortion law. However, when laws change, there can be a time period where people aren't as clear about what is allowed under new laws.

Their claim that D&C procedures are illegal under the law is false. Abortions after a heartbeat is detected is what is illegal, similar to lowa's current heartbeat law. The thing is, since the unsafe pillabortion left the remains of at least one of the twins she was carrying, the remains of the dead child was causing the sepsis. D&C is allowable in cases of miscarriage, and is often the course of action to remove the source of infection.

When the case was reviewed in the normal time frame earlier this year, it concluded that this was an avoidable death. Failure for doctors to act can lead to wrongful death lawsuits or similar. This is why it's important for doctors to know what is the legal course of action for various circumstances.

Again, nothing indicated that they delayed because of the pro-life law, but there's a chance it may have had an effect if doctors failed to act out of ignorance of the law. But they weren't provided the normal guidance even in the years before the law went into effect.

Government Update

Election

The upcoming election is critical for the pro-life movement, more than ever before. Many candidates for office want to codify Roe v. Wade. The most pro-life neighboring states to Iowa have ballot measures to create a false right to abortion. The states include Missouri, Nebraska, and South Dakota. Several other states farther away also have votes on such measures, including: Montana, Colorado, Arizona, Nevada, Florida, Maryland, and New York.

The election could also make a huge difference in terms of Planned Parenthood (PP) facilities. If those who are favorable to their business get into office, then many PP sites may remain open. If things go the other way, they may decide to close several sites, rather than waiting several years in hopes of doing more abortions.

Abortion advocates are using deceptive stories to get people to support abortion ballot measures. They also use vague language that can make ALL abortions legal. For instance, they may simply focus on a right to bodily autonomy or ensure there is an exception to abortion bans for the health of the mother. The thing is that the Doe v. Bolton case that's still in place defined health so broadly that EVERY pregnancy qualifies as a health exception.

<u>Iowa</u>

In Iowa, we vote whether to retain judges. Of the Iowa Supreme Court justices, only one justice appears on the ballot. Normally, judges don't draw much attention. However, the Supreme Court Justice up for retention ruled in favor of Iowa's Heartbeat Law, and it was decided by a narrow 4-3 ruling.

Thus, the media and abortion advocates are trying to oppose his retention, while pro-lifers tend to push to keep him. There is a push to get lawmakers to protect life at conception, like many states in the South have already done. The courts could likely uphold such a law, if passed into law. But if any changes occur to the court, it could lead to unknown outcomes.

<u>North Dakota</u>

A North Dakota judge ruled that abortion should be legal in that state. The state's only abortion provider previously moved to Moorhead, Minnesota, just across the state border. This leaves abortion at least temporarily legal in that state, but with no abortion provider. This is yet another case that reveals the importance of staying vigilant in protecting life.

Single-Issue Voting?

Many people think pro-lifers are single-issue voters. We tend to recognize that issues aren't of equal consequence. Thus, we prioritize the most fundamental right to life. Roughly half of candidates disqualify themselves of our vote by supporting abortion, so we don't tend to get to lesser issues.

Keep Praying

Pray for the protection of human life throughout the states. Pray for the closure of the businesses that kill for money. Pray for the protection of life to prevail in the upcoming election.
